The majority of the district violations that occur on the home campuses are not repeated behaviors at the Alternative School. Edgenuity has online intervention programs that will assist and pinpoint learning gaps and provide a targeted, data-driven instructional pathway to help students with instruction.







Nederland Independent School District Regular Education vs. Special Education Placements to AES







Nederland Independent School District Special Education Placements by Campus






Nederland Independent School District Special Education Placements by Administrator










Nederland Independent School District Mandatory Drug Comparison












Nederland Independent School District Alternative Education School Total Placements by Administrator







Nederland Independent School District Alternative Education School Age of Placement
