

## School Attendance Warning!!

I must remind you the importance of your child attending school. Texas' Compulsory Attendance statutes refer to "Truancy" as failure to attend school. **You** can be prosecuted for failure to attend, a Class C Misdemeanor offense, punishable by a fine up to <u>\$500</u>, <u>loss of Driver's License</u> and other remedies if the student has unexcused voluntary absences for:

- 10 or more days or parts of days within a six month period, or
- 3 or more days or parts of days within a four-week period.
  - o Ed. Code 25.094

It is a parent's duty to monitor and <u>require the student to attend school!</u> Texas law also deals directly with parents and guardians of students. This category of offense is called <u>"Contributing to Truancy."</u> This offense is punishable by <u>fines</u>, <u>court costs</u>, and other remedies <u>including jail</u>. A parent commits an offense:

- If a warning was issued at the beginning of the school year.
- The parent, with criminal negligence, fails to require the child to attend school as required by law.
  - o Ed. Code 25.093

## Upon conviction I <u>will</u> sentence as allowed by the law!!!!! Go to school everyday, on time, ready to work!!!!

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
